WHAT'S NEW AT THE MUSEUM?

Great News!

As part of our process to achieve a full charter for the museum, we needed a lease agreement with the Town of Marion for the use of the building. I am pleased to report the Town Board has passed a resolution granting us a 30 year lease at a cost of \$1 per year. We also will have ownership of the collection of items that has been amassed over the past 40 plus years. The Town of Marion will be responsible for all building maintenance and systems, utility costs and snow removal and the MHA will need to pay for any alterations to the interior to suit our purposes. This straightens out a tangle and crosses one more item off our TO DO list for completing our final charter process. The next item on the list is creating a Disaster and Emergency Preparedness plan.

Work, Work, Work!

Great news! We had several major projects completed in the museum. The first involved installing the siding on the new addition. We have had the siding since before the COVID pandemic but had a delay during that time and then could not find a qualified contractor. Enter Cornelius Construction! They did a wonderful job and it looks super!

We then contracted to have the chimney taken down. We had a leak over the winter that caused the drywall in the main parlor to crack. It was much more cost efficient to take the chimney down than repair it. The

contractors who did this work were Brick, Blocks and Stone, Inc. We were also fortunate to have the plumbing done to the bathroom before the Fall Festival. It is wonderful to have on site ADA compliant facilities now. Thanks to Burgio and Son Plumbing for completing this work in time.



Our next project involves painting all three porches. The front porch was peeling, the side porch on the south side had never been painted and the new entrance also needed to be done. This will be completed before the snow flies. We are grateful to the Town of Marion for approving financing for this work.

Charter Change

At the last meeting of the Marion Historic Association, it was decided to try and simplify membership renewals. We were currently trying to do renewals on a rolling basis but it was not efficient. The Board of Directors voted to go a simple once a year system where everyone will renew in January. Membership renewal letters will be in the mail in November 2022 for 2023 membership. Thank you to all who have recently mailed your membership renewals.

WAYNE COUNTY BICENTENNIAL UPDATE

The Wayne County Bicentennial Committee has been busy. We have quite a schedule of planned events.

The kick-off celebration will be April 11, 2023 in the Town of Lyons in front of the courthouse, followed by a light luncheon for invited guests at the Lyons Community Center.

In May, we have the Bicentennial Gala planned at Carey Lake in Walworth. Tickets will be going on sale soon. The Gala will feature John Kucko as a speaker.



I found it on an 1894 map listed as the Seth E. Harkness homestead. The current owner told me their deed also listed VanHaneghan and Cook as previous owners. The estimated size was approximately 40 feet long, 30 feet wide and 24 feet tall. The barn currently has one end wall

One of the nice things about this work is when people contact me with questions about their home. I love to be able to tell them something but it isn't often easy. I quite often learn from them. Recently, the Semmler family contacted me about the home they had just purchased at 5117 Eddy Ridge Rd. I had my eye on this place since I became historian and mourned the fact that it was slowly decaying into the brush. The house appeared to be a lake stone construction with stucco exterior. The southern wing roof had collapsed but the main house was still standing tall, with original porch posts and moldings. Then the owner sent me this photo of the original barn! I was astounded at the size of it! Do any of you have a memory to share about this barn?

Part of our recent display at the Fall Festival included several items, two of which were recent acquisitions. The yarn winder was donated by Dr. and Mrs. Thomas Stevens. It is a family piece and in very nice condition. The museum did not have one in its' collection. Thank you also to Dr. and Mrs. Stevens for their financial contribution to help us complete the electrical work in the basement.

The Caldwell Place sign was an auction find. The Rich Dairy used Guernsey cows for their milk production and raised award winning animals. The sign is two sided and in reasonable shape for being about 75 years old. Because it had all these elements, the Marion Historic Association voted to purchase it for the museum. It will be placed in the Agriculture display when we get it up.

The third item is not new but we thought it was fun to put it out so children could guess what it was for. It is a Nortier's Dairy milk box. We placed two milk bottles in it so we could tell the story of how milk used to be delivered to the home by local dairys.
